WELCOME FROM OUR BOARD PRESIDENT

Dear Friends: Welcome to the 75th Anniversary Celebration of Holmes Camp and Retreat Center.

As each of you know, Holmes provides a welcoming Christian community where, in a natural setting, lives change, and faith grows. It offers hope, renewal and a sense of belonging. It is truly a place of stillness in a turbulent world. Each of us is here this evening because Holmes, in one way or another, has impacted our lives, direct



way or another, has impacted our lives, directly or through family and friends.

When Holmes was founded in 1946, the world was a much simpler place. Now, everything moves at a lightening pace, as we are bombarded with information, images and "pitches." But **the last 18 months**

have also



shown us that people yearn for love, support and companionship as well as a safe place to experience the beauty of nature, the joy of communion with the Lord and fellowship with others. So, even though Holmes is turning 75, it is more relevant now than ever before.

Prior to the pandemic, Holmes introduced new programming, such as

Camp Q; the response from the campers that attended and their parents, as well as PC-USA and the local Presbyteries, was overwhelming-

ly positive. During the pandemic, Holmes presented **on-line church services** that were seen by thousands. This fall, Holmes is introducing an **Advent prep class** for church leaders and an **online confirmation program**. And, planning is now underway to continue to expand into other new and innovative programming for next summer and beyond.



But in order to move forward, **Holmes needs to continue to invest in its infrastructure.** The opening of **Vinik Hilltop** was a major step in expanding the residence options offered at Holmes. However, some of the other buildings are aging and also need love and attention. A campaign is presently ongoing to raise funds to revitalize **Agape**. And, be-



cause of a recently discovered water leak, significant work will also be required to rehabilitate **Nunemaker**, a building that came online in 1973 and has provided thousands of campers and church groups with a true camping experience. **The funds raised during this 75th Anniversary Celebration will support the efforts at restoring Nunemaker**, so please purchase an item in the silent auction and use the envelopes placed on your dinner tables to give generously.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, **thank you for attending this event.** Please enjoy the 75th Anniversary Celebration and continue to support Holmes and its future.

Dear Friends,

While I have only been a part of the Holmes Camp community for a short time I have had the chance to see the community accomplish some amazing things. Since the last Holmes Gala, despite the ongoing pandemic, we have:

- Opened Vinik Hilltop, with ten beautiful rooms and additional meeting space
- Made significant progress on renovations in Agape, with new roofing, upgraded HVAC in several rooms, and major upgrades to the kitchen
- Ventured into the world of online programming, launching several new programs
- Begun to welcome back camps, conferences, and retreat groups—old and new—from across the region.

Looking forward there is the potential for amazing things! Holmes is blessed with passionate volunteers, generous donors, an active board of directors, a rich history, and a stunning location with extensive infrastructure. Holmes Camp & Retreat Center is looking forward to spring confirmation retreats, a busy winter of retreats and camp rentals, and introducing our *Snow Place Like Holmes* family dinner and camp benefit this coming February. We are also excited to





resume our

own residential summer camp with revamped programming and new options for teens in summer 2022.

However, as we look towards the future, we also face some challenges. Most immediately, the COVID-19 pandemic wears on, impacting our capacity and program options as we strive to keep our community safe. The associated staffing and supply chain complications have been felt as well. And apart from the short-term challenges of the pandemic much of our infrastructure is aging and requires significant ongoing maintenance or major repairs. We are actively renovating Agape in an ongoing project, and due to water damage Nunemaker requires significant repairs before it can again welcome campers, churches, and families. Holmes relies on donors like you to help us through these, and many others, facilities projects.





But what has stood out to me the most in my short time among you is not the programming, the potential, or the facilities. It is the community. You have welcomed me in with open arms and wonderful support. You are quick to share a story of camp, or what that memory means to you. You hold Holmes Camp, the people and the place, close to your heart. Thank you all.

And lastly I would be remiss to not take the opportunity to publicly thank Grace, Paul,

and Ryan; the members of our community with whom I interact every day. Without their warm welcome, diverse skills, and herculean efforts, these few months I've been with you all would not have been possible.

On their behalf, and my own, I would like to thank you for being a part of the Holmes community, and for being here tonight.
