Outstanding Alumnus Award



Think of Holmes and many things come to mind: the trees and trails, the lakes, the friends and, not least of all, the buildings. Long-time board member Gary Wolf has had a hand in every one of those buildings over the last 60 years, which is just one of many reasons that the board of Holmes Camp and Retreat Center is pleased to honor Gary with the Outstanding Alumnus Award.

For 50 years Gary chaired the Holmes Board site committee which oversees buildings and grounds at Holmes. He has helped manage the construction of new buildings, identified the most pressing needs of older buildings, and has even moved buildings from one location to another. And when cornerstones have been laid or new buildings dedicated at Holmes in the last 60 years or when major projects have been accomplished, Gary has been there every time.

The dedication of Nunemaker in 1972, Gary was there. The cornerstone for Agape in 1982, that, too. Hayden in 1987, the moving of camper cabins from Westminster up to the North and South Units in 1981. The refurbishing of Steidl 1981. That, too. But most important was overseeing the construction of Charlotte's Room in 1998 - 1999, which was named in honor of Charlotte M. Hostetter. Gary worked closely with Paul Verdesi on that project and said, "We poured our heart and soul into that building."

Gary was also was chairman of the site committee for Minden Retreat Center in Bridge Hampton, Long Island.

Gary is a longtime member of Community Presbyterian Church of Deer Park, NY, and first came to Holmes as a camper in 1955. (He has a picture of his name scribbled on a wall of his cabin from back then.) In 1963 he started as a counselor, coming to Holmes as a volunteer for a week in the summer. Gary and his wife, Kathy, whom he knew from the Deer Park church, married in 1966 and continued as counselors together for several years.

He and Kathy were among the first to lead canoe trips sponsored by Holmes. Gary and Kathy volunteered as counselors for Junior II campers at Denton for many years and then Gary was the volunteer director for Week II for many years at Westminster. Over the years, Gary and Kathy returned to


Holmes with groups from the Deer Park church for camping weekends at Robinson in June, retreats in November, and work weekends. They also joined Holmes director Don Hostetter on a dozen or more of Holmes sponsored international and U.S. trips in the 1980s and '90s. "We had a blast on those trips," Gary said.

During Gary's half century as chair of the Holmes site committee, he has helped keep buildings in good repair and saved money for Holmes. For example, when windows for Charlotte's Room were estimated at \$90,000, Gary found a Long Island contractor who did the job for \$30,000. And Gary often brought "Gary's Goodies" to Holmes, including hardware, tools, and plumbing supplies from his personal stock, and desks, file cabinets, tables, and light stands from his professional job as a defense industry project manager on Long Island.

Gary and Kathy have three daughters, Jayne, Karen, and Nancy, who were Holmes campers and, later, life guards. They also have 3 grand children, Ayla, Cassidy Bradley, and Richard Silverblade.

We are grateful to Gary for his 60 years of service to Holmes and the Holmes board.

The Wayfinder Experience

Living the Mission Award



The Wayfinder Experience has flourished over the past 23 years because it empowers youth, promotes friendships, and builds community. Not only that but the live-action role playing (LARP) Adventure Games at the heart of the Wayfinder program are down right fun. For this work, the board of Holmes Camp & Retreat Center is pleased to honor The Wayfinder Experience with its Living the Mission award.

The partnership between Wayfinder and Holmes Camp began before Wayfinder's inception when the predecessor to Wayfinder, Adventure Game Theater (AGT), ran overnight camps at Denton Lake. For the past 12 years, and beyond, Wayfinder

has offered one to four week-long overnight summer programs at Holmes, drawing teens from across the U.S. and Europe. The week-long camps fill with around 65 campers each session. Toward the end of each week, someone walking through Holmes might see the playfields filled with dozens of kids running around wielding foam swords, wearing helmets, tiaras or goggles, and immersed in epic fantastical battle.

The theme of every week is different so on any given week the woods, fields, and buildings around Holmes might be transformed into pirate ships, encampments or castles for imaginary worlds, and the final battles might be harder to find because they are set at nightfall or are being waged at the far reaches of campus deep in the woods. On the last night of camp, songs and other performances can be heard by the crackling of the fire as teens express themselves around the end-of-week camp fire they call Bardic Circle.

In the earlier days of each week, the teens have gotten acquainted with Wayfinder through taking part in workshops on improv, magic, and sword fighting as well as creating characters, selecting costumes, and planning team dynamics for the big Adventure!

Adventure Games aren't just games, of course. The power of LARPing is an opportunity for imaginative play that helps teens learn about themselves. According to one of Wayfinder owners, Trine Boode-Petersen, some teens realize that in the LARP they are capable of charging into battle when they didn't think they could. And then they might realize they can do the same in their real lives back home. After Adventure Games, campers have ample opportunities to talk about their experiences and feelings within the

Adventures and how they might pertain to their everyday life. Teens are also given plenty of time during the week to bond and grow together as they take on deeper moral issues our Adventure Games challenge them with.

In addition to Overnight camps at Holmes, the Wayfinder Experience, which is based in Kingston, offers programs in schools and community spaces focused on topics such as theater, literacy, community building and more. It also offers day-camp programs at several locations in the Hudson Valley.

Rev. Donald A. Hostetter Leadership Award



The Holmes board is pleased to honor David Burpee with The Rev. Donald A. Hostetter Leadership Award for his over 50 years of support to the Holmes Camp, stretching from his first years as a teenage staff member to about 15 years as president of the board of directors, to generous financial contributions by David and his wife, Linda.

David came to Holmes as a counselor-in-training in 1970 at the invitation of long-time Holmes director Rev. Donald Hostetter whom he'd met at a meeting. Nine more summers as a staff member followed, with jobs including counselor with special needs kids, a canoe trip leader and support driver, and as lifeguard and head lifeguard. David met his future wife, Linda, in front of the Westminster Lodge in 1973 after she had participated in a Holmes Camp sponsored international trip to Taize that year.

David began his service as a member of the Holmes board and its committees when he was in his early 20s. During the 1990s and early 2000s, when Bill Key and then Peter Surgenor were camp directors, he served numerous terms as the board's president. David's time serving on the Holmes board and its committees spanned many changes including the addition of the Vinik building and four executive directors.

In his professional life, David has been a police officer for almost 45 years, first in White Plains where he retired as a Captain six years ago after administering their training school for over 30 years, and then in Somers, NY, where he still works part-time. Prior to being a police officer David was a paramedic working both on an ambulance and as an EMS instructor at White Plains Hospital and EMS paramedic supervisor.


David and Linda are long-time members of Bedford Presbyterian Church where he is a ruling elder. In 2023 David earned his Masters of Divinity Degree (MDiv) from New York Theological Seminary and has since been serving as a pulpit supply preacher within Hudson River Presbytery and as a volunteer chaplain at Ghost Ranch in New Mexico. He has also continually served on various committees of the Hudson River Presbytery for over 30 years, including the Committee on Preparation for Ministry and the Committee on Ministry, and most recently on the Presbytery executive

Council. David also served twice as a commissioner to the PC (USA) General Assembly.

David and Linda have three grown children. When the kids were younger, Linda directed a week-long family camp every summer at Holmes for over 20 years. Like David, Linda has served on the Holmes board and as a volunteer.

In addition to David's service at Holmes, he is currently serving on the board of the National Ghost Ranch Foundation which operates Ghost Ranch, an education and retreat center in New Mexico owned by the Presbyterian Church (USA).

David will tell you that Holmes has been transformative in his life, and that the blessings that Holmes has added to his life far outweigh any contributions that he and Linda have made to Holmes. He says that Holmes has saved him, given him all that is good in his life, and has provided him with purpose, faith, the love of his life, extraordinary friends who have supported and nurtured him – the people he loves and respects more than all others and knows love him in return. He says that Holmes has been for him, a gift from God. He is especially honored to receive this honor in Don Hostetter's name, someone who was a mentor and an incredibly important person in his life, and in the life of hundreds of others. With gratitude to Don for giving all of us "Camp," and Glory to God for such a wonderful life.

PASTORAL RESPITE STUDIO

Holmes is grateful for the leadership, sacrifice, and service pastors, elders, missionaries, and others serving in ministry share with their churches and communities. In honor of that service, and in alignment with our core values of Faith, Hospitality, and Rest, Holmes now offers free respite and personal sabbath lodging.

Our Pastoral Respite Lodging, made possible in part by a grant from the Houston Family Foundation, includes a queen bed, desk, and kitchenette including refrigerator, stove, convection oven/microwave and sink. There is a private accessible bathroom. You are welcome to enjoy your privacy and prepare your own meals, or purchase meals for \$10 per person/per meal when the dining room is open and operating.

To start, free respite lodging will be available to all those engaged in professional ministry, chairs of session, and retired Teaching Elders within the Presbyteries of Long Island, Hudson River, and New York City. We will also welcome those serving in full-time ministry outside our three presbyteries. Lodging may be reserved up to 2 nights per calendar year, subject to availability. 
