

## To Register for Christmas Camp:

## Camp Information:

Campers and staff will stay in Nunemaker, our youth retreat building with two wings of cabin-style rooms of bunk beds and shared bathrooms, on either side of communal spaces for fellowship and recreation. Campers will live in rooms with campers and a counselor of same gender and similar age.

The weather in December can be a bit unpredictable, but we plan to spend as much time outside as we can, hiking, exploring and playing. The temperature at Holmes is often 10-15 cooler than at home; please help your camper(s) pack accordingly!

**Check-in is Wednesday, December 27 at 3:00 pm** at Nunemaker. Staff will ensure we have all necessary forms, fees, and medication.

**Closing Program is Saturday, December 30 at 10:00 am** at Nunemaker. Campers will share about their time at Holmes and will be able to make purchases from our Canteen.

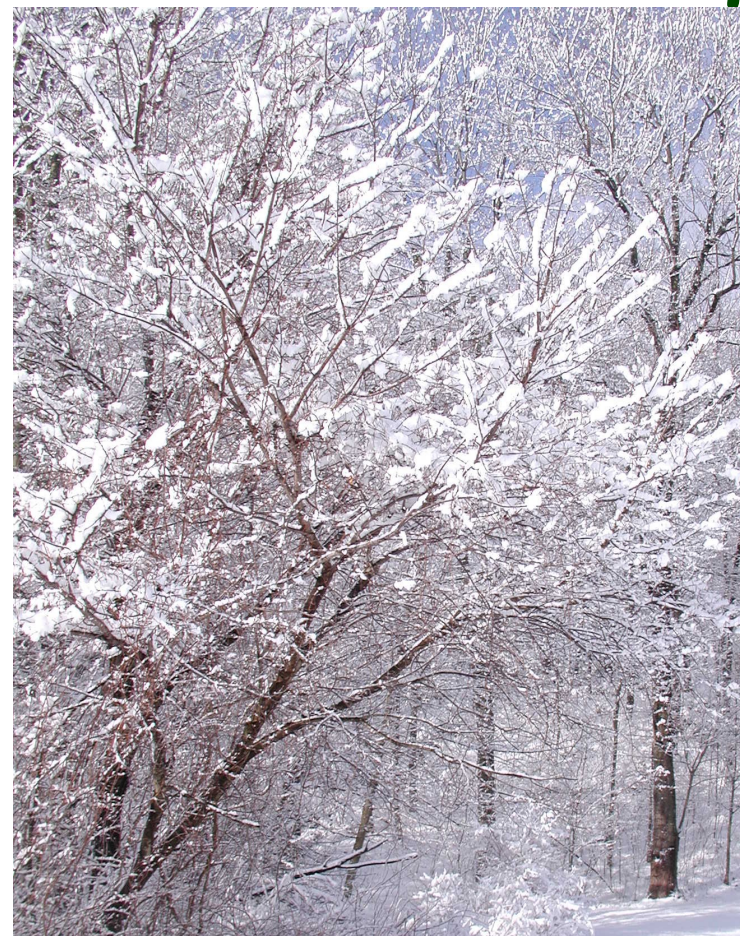
